BPRS-C is similar to the Brief Psychiatric Rating Scale (BPRS) for adults (Overall & Gorham, 1962) in providing a format for rating the presence and severity of 21 symptoms on individual 7-point scale items ranging from not present to extremely severe The aim of the BPRS-C, as embodied in the rating scale format provided in the Appendix to this

BPRS was first designed for use in 1962 (Overall and Gorham) to be an efficient, rapid evaluation of change due to treatment, as well as to give an overall description of major symptom characteristics Since then, the BPRS has been revised to include 24 items and is referred to as the Brief Psychiatric Rating Scale—Extended (BPRS-E)

The Brief Psychiatric Rating Scale (BPRS) •The BPRS measures major psychotic and non-psychotic symptoms in patients with major mental disorders •Can be applied to outpatient or inpatient populations •May be the most researched instrument in psychiatry •The 24-item version used in Chapter 146 has excellent reliability
